





POWERWASH

Flushing BID's nightly power washing service removes grease and various stains, to keep our sidewalks clean and fresh for pedestrians

and businesses during the day. In continuing efforts to 'Keep Flushing Fresh', the Summer Street Power Washing Program provided additional cleaning for some of the heavy pedestrian traffic sidewalks, during the busiest season in Downtown Flushing



ILLEGAL POSTINGS REMOVAL

This spring, the BID's sanitation crews worked hard to remove all the illegal postings from over 50 streetlamp poles in downtown Flushing.



TRASH RECEPTACLES

The BID manages and services near 100 trash receptacles, including New York City recycle bins in the downtown Flushing area, cleans and repairs them on a regular basis to promote a clean and healthy Flushing. With the support of Neighborhood Challenge Grants for NYC Waste Management Initiatives, the BID was able to install 100 wall-mounted ashtrays in June 2022 to reduce cigarette butt littering.



HEALTHY WALKING TOUR (9/3-9/12)

In the past September, the BID hosted the Flushing Healthy Walking Tour to promote healthy living styles. The Flushing community and people from all five boroughs participated and walked around Flushing, as well as explored and supported the various small businesses in Downtown Flushing.











2022 Flushina Health Fair hosted by the BID last November. was an open-to-all community event designed to share the most up to date health information and resources to Flushing local residents.





SANITATION

Throughout the year, Flushing BID provided sanitation services day and night in the Downtown Flushing area. Our sanitation crew continued to sweep sidewalks. replaced trash bin liners, and reported illeaal aarbaae dumping. In the colder seasons, critical service included snow removal at crosswalk intersections.




HALLOWEEN SAFETY

First-ever Restaurant Week in the last week of May, featured 15 local restaurants that successfully attracted thousands of foodies.






BUSINESS SAFETY MEETING WITH 109TH PRECINCT




